Under the direct supervision of the Maintenance Supervisor, the Industrial Mechanic is responsible for the installation, inspection, maintenance and repairs to mechanical, hydraulic, pneumatic, HVAC and plumbing equipment at Transit Facilities.

As the *Industrial Mechanic* you will be:

- Performing inspections, preventive maintenance functions, troubleshooting and repairing Transit building mechanical systems and controls including exhaust fans, air handlers, make up air units, some components of boilers, chillers, air conditioning units as allowed by code, overhead doors, cranes, hoisting equipment, lifting equipment, washing equipment, air compressors and pneumatic systems, shop machines and equipment.
- Performing layout, assembly, installations and modifications to mechanical equipment in accordance with all codes and regulations.
- Assisting in developing preventive maintenance schedules and procedures related to mechanical, HVAC and plumbing equipment.
- Maintaining and updating blueprints and drawings to document modifications and component changes to mechanical equipment.
- Assisting in the training of General Helpers (eg. cleaning coils, replacing filters, etc.)

Your experience includes:

- High School graduation or equivalent.
- Working experience with hydraulic in-ground and above ground hoist systems would be a definite asset.
- Demonstrated ability to read and interpret wiring, schematic and control drawings for PLC and hard-wired control circuits and use test equipment to diagnose equipment faults.
- Installation and repair of various styles of industrial overhead doors, gear boxes and door controls.

Requirements:

- Must be a Certified Journeyman Industrial Mechanic (Millwright) recognized by the Province of Manitoba. **A legible copy of the Journeyman Industrial Mechanic (Millwright) certificate must be submitted with your application.**
- Must have a minimum of five years of experience at the Journeyman Industrial Mechanic (Millwright) tradesman level (installing, trouble shooting and repairing mechanical equipment).
- Must possess a valid Manitoba Class 5 Driver's License. **A copy of your driver's license must be submitted with your application.**
- Must be physically capable of performing the routine manual labour components of the position, which may include but are not limited to: heavy lifting (up to 100lbs), maneuvering within or around large equipment, exposure to extreme weather conditions, dust, noise, diesel exhaust fumes and chemical agents used in the mechanical field.
- Applicants will be required to undergo testing to determine their knowledge, skill and ability as they relate to the position.
- The successful applicant(s) will be required to undergo a medical assessment at the Occupational Health Branch.
- A Criminal Record Check satisfactory to the employer will be required from the applicant(s) or successful candidate(s), at their expense.
- The successful applicant(s) must have a complete set of Mechanic's hand tools on their first day of employment.
